

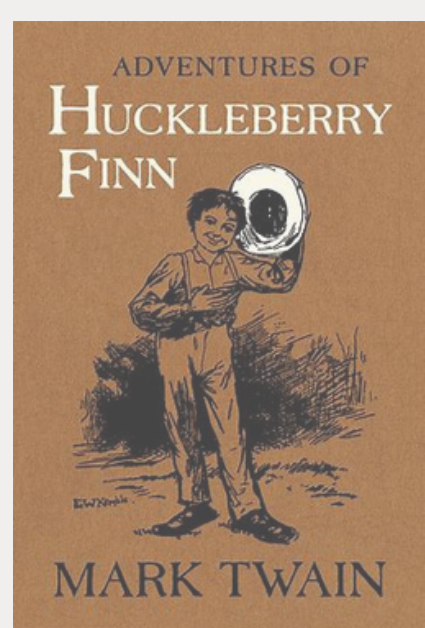
Museum Scavenger Hunt

- Who was the “original” Huckleberry Finn?

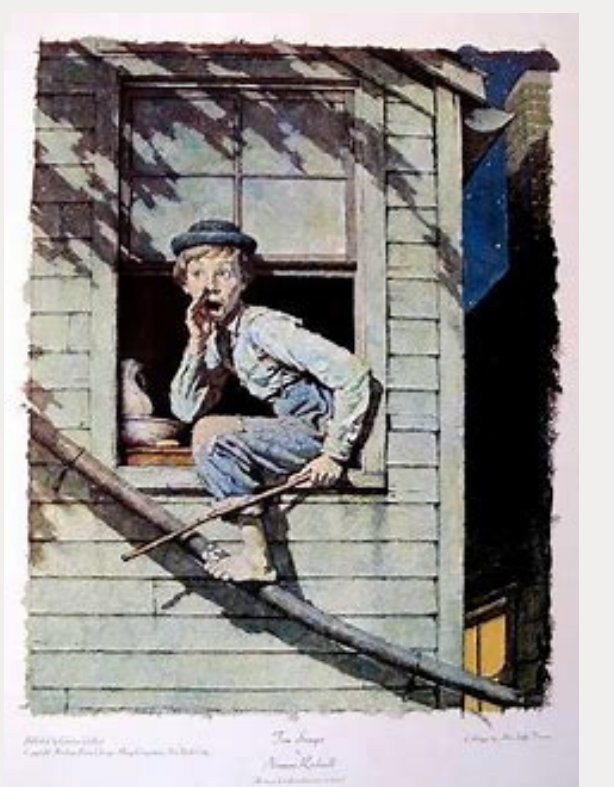
- What did Mark Twain say about the original Huck?

7. Mezzanine/Second Floor

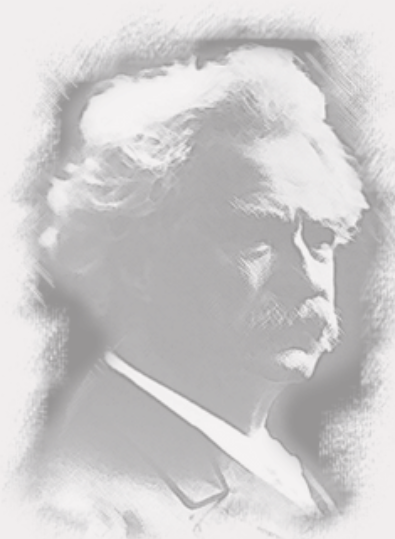
- How many steamboats did Samuel Clemens Pilot?
